
FOND D'AIDE, ON ROCK AND RICOCHET

New Stained Glass Window!

This Guido Nincheri stained glass window, housed in a shadow box, hung in Trinity United Church in Shawinigan in memory of Rev. & Mrs. Robert Charleton who served the church from 1929 - 1951. Trinity United Church was sold and the window was moved to St. Stephen's Anglican Church in Grandmere. In 2016, St. Stephen's was sold and the window (valued at \$80,000 at the time) was moved to Knowlton United Church where it was held in trust for The United Church of Canada. With the sale of Knowlton United Church in 2023, the stained glass was given to the Nakonha:ka Regional Council of The United Church of Canada.

Roxboro United Church offered to look after this beautiful work of art until our region has a suitable place to hang it.

Thank you to Darryl and Frankie for hanging it on our wall!



Guido Nincheri was knighted by the Italian government in 1972. In 1992, Nincheri was honoured for his contribution during Montreal's 350th anniversary celebrations, and in 1997 one of his 1940 stained glass windows was on a Canadian 45-cent stamp.
